"SOUPER BOWL" FOOD DRIVE, FEB. 1

& 2 REPORT By: Bob Roberti



This year a rainy weekend did not dampen the spirits of the participants of the SCA Annual "SOUPER BOWL" Food Drive. Once again

Sedgefield residents demonstrated their generosity and concern to assist their neighbors in the Parsippany Troy Hills community at large. No records were set this year, but the SCA was able to donate over 25 bags/boxes of good quality food items to the Parsippany Food Pantry. This year the majority of the food donations consisted of hearty canned soups that can easily be served as a meal. Canned vegetables and condensed soup were also in abundance. Boxed items such as pasta, macaroni & cheese, cereals, and Rice a Roni were also frequently donated. There was an absence of such staples as: Peanut & Jelly, canned meats and canned tuna. These items were in short supply. Last year generous SCA residents donated \$450.00 cash. The best year ever!! This year our monetary donations were only \$245.00. We thank those individuals who gave cash donations so generously this year. The Parsippany Food Pantry uses the money to purchase food items such as powered milk, canned fruit, and condiments. NO MONEY is distributed to residents who rely on the Food Pantry services.

SCA Board Member **Dan Zarzycki** collected the food from **Carlos Guzman** and **Bob Roberti**'s houses and delivered it to the Food Pantry. We are Thankful to Dan, Carlos and Bob for their service and dedication to Sedgefield. I later visited the Food Pantry and learned

more about their services. Staff from the Parsippany Department of Health overseas the operations of the Food Pantry. There are usually two volunteers who work inside the pantry. If you wish to have access to food from the panty you need to complete a form at the Health Department, show proof of residency and declare your financial need. The Parsippany Health Department does not verify your information but keeps it on file. The declaration of financial need is on the honor system. There are currently 40 Parsippany residents registered to receive food supplements from the Food Pantry. This number has peaked to 40 in recent years, but has remained steady. The majority of residents needing food supplements are the elderly, living alone, with meager incomes. The second group needing food supplements are women, usually divorced, with children at home. Most of these women are working, but cannot adequately support their children. Unofficially, most of these women would be fine if the "Dead Beat Dads" would only pay up court mandated child support. I learned a great deal of information that day speaking with staff and volunteers.

Please let me extend my deepest **thanks** to all Sedgefield residents who donated from their hearts to support our community. I consider our Food Drive a labor of love.

BAN ON SINGLE USE PLASTIC BAGS FEB. 6

The ban on single use plastic bags in Parsippany went into effect February 6, 2020. Stores will no longer supply shoppers with plastic bags. You must bring a reusable shopping bag with you **OR** the store will provide you with a recycle PAPER BAG and charge 10-25 cents per bag.
