
OBITUARIES

DOWN THE GARDEN PATH By: Bob Roberti

Follow-Up to Planting Bulbs Article:

Since the November and December weather has been so mild, planting Fall bulbs has been so delightful. **Beautification Committee** members planted **90 yellow Daffodil** bulbs at the Sedgefield signs and **100 huge yellow Daffodil bulbs** in Grafton Park. I was a busy beaver around my own house planting 200 red Tulips in front of the porch, 155 **Daffodil bulbs** in front and back yards, and 80 **Crocus** and **Wood Hyacinth** bulbs in a raised bed around a tree. I am eagerly anticipating many magnificent spring blooms this year.

Winter Pruning:

Winter is an excellent time of year to prepare for spring by pruning back your shrubs and trees. **Pruning** is nothing more than cutting back or shaping up bushes and trees. We have many large trees in Sedgefield. Remove dead or diseased limbs or limbs too close to your home. I NEVER advocate cutting down a tree unless it is dead or leaning too much and will eventually fall causing injury. Trees are too important in our ecological system to be removed without cause. In Grafton Park alone we lost approximately 50 trees during Hurricane Sandy and during the cleanup of the park. Some of those trees were 36 to 42 inches in diameter, hundreds of years old. I strongly urge Sedgefield residents to plant a tree in 2022. Last year I planted two small cherry trees in my back yard. When pruning a tree, I usually use a bow saw or hand pruning saw to get the job done.

Flowering trees, bushes and evergreen plantings require pruning every year. In Sedgefield we have many flowering trees and bushes, i.e., azaleas, rhododendron, dogwood, rose of Sharon, and rose bushes just to name a few. Since these flowering plants grow faster, the new growth is young and tender. Using a sharp handheld pruning sheer shape up this year's new growth and cut out dead branches. NEVER use a dull sheer, the cut must be made clean. A dull cut will pinch the branch and leave it susceptible to infection or disease.



Boxwood shrubs are one of the easiest shrubs to grow in Sedgefield. They are deer resistant, require little care, grow slowly, and remain green all year long. Boxwood is easy to prune. I use my electric hedge sheer to gently shape the

Boxwood to grow round or like the top of an ice cream cone. You can prune or shape Boxwood to grow square or into a long hedge row. Boxwood leaves are small and grow close together causing the shrub to appear very dense. These branches are very tender therefore try to remove any snow or ice off the shrub or the branches may snap or become damaged.

The owner, Rudi Stark, was a master at his craft for homemade confectionary delights. His milk and dark chocolates were out of this world. Rudi also presented his Valentine boxed candy in a unique way. He would purchase the most beautiful heart shaped boxes. The outside top of the box had a silky satin lightly padded finish. It almost felt like a silky pillow. The beautiful boxes were displayed on the candy counter. I was always first to place my order. As my daughters grew older, I decided to buy each a different designed box of candy. Holsten's always put the heart in a square box then wrapped it with Valentine's Day wrapping. Valentine's Day arrived, each of my girls would pick a box, not knowing what beautiful heart would be inside. I continued this tradition every year including this year. Our daughter, Amanda, is a professor at San Francisco State University so we send her candy via the U.S. Postal service. My wife, Nina, and my daughters, Dana, Melissa, and Amanda would then pose for a picture in our living room.

The years have passed, the candy is eaten, but the tradition continues. We still have the pictures and the empty Valentine Day boxes have been saved. Rudi Stark has retired. Ronald Stark and Christopher Carley still own Holsten's. In fact, Nina and I were there on Valentine's Day to enjoy "ice cream for lunch", a large wet walnut, hot fudge, sundae with coffee chip ice cream, whipped cream, and a cherry. In January inflation rose 7.5%, while the national inflation average rate is the highest in 40 years. I never

paid much attention to these numbers while working, earning a good living, and enjoying excellent company paid benefits. Now that I am retired, things are changing. I purchased and service my own private vehicle. I noticed gas prices have almost doubled since the start of the Pandemic. I understand wife, Nina, complains about the prices supermarket. Speaking with others in our age group, I understand what they are dealing with. I also see the struggle younger families, with children, are facing. I thank God that we are blessed but look for ways to help reduce spending and save in areas when possible.

Nina always cut cost by using apps or scanning coupons to help at the supermarket. I shop at the Acme Supermarket, in Denville, only **on Tuesdays**, because they a seniors 5% discount on offer all items. Acme also has a display counter with various meats, chicken, and fish. You may choose 4 prepackaged items for \$19.99. Last week the 4 items we chose were: 2 small 2 lb. pork roast, 2 thick pork chops, and 2 large chicken breasts. This purchase would have cost close to \$28.00. The Agway Garden Center, in Morristown, offers a seniors 5% discount on all purchases on Tuesdays. I filled my propane tanks, purchased garden supplies, 2 cherry trees. and 2 shrubs. Agway also provided FREE delivery for the trees and shrubs. Uncle Giuseppe's, in Morris Plains, just opened with big sales on certain items. Uncle Giuseppe's offered \$5.00 coupons if you spent \$50.00 or more and \$10.00 coupons if you spent \$100.00 or more. One of the produce specials that Nina was able to get was artichokes for \$1.00 each. When she went back for more the next day, they were sold out. The produce manager said they sold 36 cases in one day. Uncle Giuseppe's offers a seniors 5% discount on all purchases on Wednesday. These are just a small example of savings in our local area. I am sure there are more.

Many companies like Bed Bath and Beyond are very generous with their coupon offers. This is especially helpful when purchasing household items or giving gifts for various occasions as wedding showers. Even Holsten's Brookdale Confectionary in Bloomfield, NJ recognized the need to fight inflation. If you pay your bill in cash, you can save 3.5% over a credit card transaction. Many economists are predicting higher cost for goods and services in 2022. Supply shortages will continue to drive up prices. We need to look for discounts and savings anywhere we can to help fight rising inflation cost.

A scene from the final episode of the highly viewed T.V. drama series "Los Sopranos" an American crime drama television series created by David Chase revolving around the fictional New Jersey-based Italian American mobster Tony Soprano (James Gandolfini) was filmed around the corner from Sedgefield? Filmed at the Raceway Gas Station located on route 10 and route 202, the scene showed the fictional assassination of one of the mob bosses' while stopping to get gas with his family. In the background you can clearly view the Barns and Noble bookstore and the Chevy's restaurant that was opened at the time.

The show portrayed the difficulties the mob boss faced as he tried to balance the conflicting requirements of his home life and his criminal organization. The Sopranos had been regarded by some as the greatest television series of all time. The series also won a multitude of awards, including Peabody Awards for its first two seasons, twenty-one Emmy Awards and five Golden Globe Awards. A staple of 2000s American popular culture, the series was the subject of critical analysis, controversy, and parody, and has spawned books. **James Gandolfini**, a three-time Emmy winner, died on June 19, 2013, at the age of 51. The series is available on Netflix.


DID YOU KNOW? By: Carlos Guzmán

In recent years due to the drastic weather changes and local emergencies, the need for traffic and alerts, especially in our area, are very important. There are ways to keep informed besides television and/or radio. You can receive real-time alerts and advisories directly from our local Parsippany police department and other local agencies instantly to your mobile phone, or computer. The Morris County Office of Emergency Management provides all jurisdictions within Morris County with Rave Mobile Safety. In Parsippany it is called **AlertParsippany**. This service provides emergency notification alerts through reverse phone calls from data provided by Verizon, along with contact information from individual users who signing up. Citizens can create a profile with Rave Mobile Safety which allows them to add extra phone numbers or email addresses for more ways to get emergency alerts. This system has the ability to send

voice, text, and email message alerts. If you would like to sign up for the alerts please do so by going to <u>Https://www.ParPolice.com</u> then click on Community Notifications at the top bar.

*One important note to remember: If you ever need to contact the Parsippany Police, Fire Dept. or Medical in an Emergency using a cell phone, it is best to call (973) 263-4300. If you call 911 from a cell it will most likely be routed to Trenton N.J. before being forwarded to our township emergency services, possibly losing precious time.


